# **President's Report**

#### **Mark Keating**

The 24/25 cricket season was another fantastic year for the club. The highlight was the first X1 winning the premiership and earning promotion up to Division 2 in the VTCA. This is the first time in the club's history that our first X1 has won back-to-back premierships. Congratulations to Paul Hetherington and the team, as they won two exciting finals matches despite being huge underdogs in the semi-final. The team displayed great determination and resilience, with Paul leading the way in both finals.

I would like to thank Paul for his leadership of the club over the past six years. Paul has notified the club that he will not be continuing as captain or coach next season. The first X1 has made finals every year during Paul's tenure, capping it off with premierships in the past two seasons. Paul has made the team competitive every year and managed to bring the best out of the players. Our thanks go to Jim Ryan as well – Jim was coach last year, but he too has indicated he will not be pursuing the role for the coming season. Just recently, the club has appointed Ben Coddington as captain/coach. Hailing from the UK, Ben has played cricket in Australia in recent years with Taylors Lakes, Druids and Caulfield South. Ben brings a wealth of coaching experience to the club, at both senior and junior levels. We welcome Ben on board and look forward to the next exciting chapter in the club's progression.

As well as the firsts premiership, the seconds finished fourth on the ladder and the thirds finished second. Unfortunately, both teams went out in the semi-final, but it shows there is plenty of depth at the club. The fourths performed well playing Sundays on turf and debuted several U13 players during the season. The women's teams did well to make the finals but went out in the semi-finals. My thanks to Ollie D'Rozario, who took on the role of female coach this season and helped look after the girls as well. Also, thanks to the captains of the senior teams – Ryan Bolton, Jonathan Rayson-Hill/Nick Keating and Jo Clements in the thirds, Anthony Clack, and Ollie D'Rozario.

Congratulations to Jacob MacDonald who won the VTCA award for best player in Division 3. As well, James Ryan, Jacob Macdonald and Brayden Macdonald were selected in the Division 4 team of the year.

The club fielded eight junior teams this season, including two and a half girl's teams. On the boy's side, we fielded 3 U13 teams, 1 U11 team and 2 U10 teams. Two of the U13 teams made finals, with the U13B team making the grand final. On the girl's side, we fielded an U16 team, a combined U13 team with Williamstown Imps and for the first time in the club's history, an U11 girls' team. Hopefully, this can provide future growth for our girl's program.

I would like to thank all our junior coaches – Derek Hill, Paul Georgiades, Ollie D'Rozario, Aaron Greaves, Hamish McGee, Chris Garcia, Alex Lavelle, Geoff Sherrard, Edwin Lee, Mark Darmanin and Daniel Otter. The coaches did a wonderful job developing players and making sure they had fun. The test of our junior program is not only about winning games but making sure the kids have fun and continue to play the game. Our Friday night Blasters program had 46 participants, and it continues to be a reliable source of players for our junior teams. Thanks go to Ben Rogers, Peta Ginnane, Dave Presley, Lee Smart and Chris Keating, who helped run the Blasters every Friday night. Overall, the club had 81 seniors registered, 98 juniors and 46 Blaster participants, totalling 225 registered participants in total.

The season saw the club continue to make effective use of the new clubrooms with some great social functions across the year. The new facilities are making a dramatic difference to the social functions and retention of players. There were some particularly good social functions run through the year, including the trivia night, wine day, past players day, the big draw, and the presentation night. These functions were well attended and made full use of the rooms.

I would like to thank all sponsors - a complete list is included in the annual report. Please give these local businesses your full support.

The club is fortunate to have a strong committee who are committed to fulfilling their roles. My thanks and appreciation go to Lee Smart (Treasurer), Ben Rogers (Secretary), Peta Ginnane (Vice President), Tom Humberstone, Lorey Bentley, Ryan Bolton and Meaghan Lavelle. Thanks also to the people who helped when asked during the season. We would welcome any additional volunteers to be on the committee. We can find you a role for you without it being a great imposition on your time.

Going forward, I hope we can expand our social functions to include partners, past players, parents, and supporters. We want to see more people at the club watching our senior and junior games. The core of our senior men's playing list is made up of players from our junior programme, hopefully this continues with the U15s coming through now. Our U16 girls are now ready to play senior women's cricket in the future.

Finally, I want to thank the committee, coaches, players, sponsors, and supporters. The club has a strong committee and is in a healthy financial position. The club had a highly successful year and continues to take steps to ensure its sustainability in future years. Our vision is to be a successful club by providing a welcoming environment to the whole community. We want to be able to give people an opportunity to play cricket in a fun and learning environment. We have certainly achieved this goal over the past season.

# **Treasurer's Report**

#### Lee Smart

No report can begin without acknowledging the back-to-back premierships achieved by the club. This is a great result for all players, families and supporters. After a twenty-year drought it is a great feeling, and a reflection of the hard work put in by not only the players involved but the Committee and club members who support them.

This represents a cash loss of \$457. On face value this seems a satisfactory result, however, a number of payments had to be deferred to post close of the financial year. We transferred \$12,000 from out Term Deposit complete our commitments for FY24/25 so they will be reflected in the FY25/26. While revenue increased substantially, so did our expenditure on a number of items, especially apparel.

Revenue wise sponsorship and grants amounted to \$51k. This is almost single handedly raised by Ben Rogers without whose dedication would mean we would be unable to provide the cheapest fees, food, drinks and functions in the competition as well paying for equipment that benefits all. Have a look at some of the larger clubs around the comp and we have better or equivalent facilities, none of which comes without significant investment.

Our bar takings were down which can be improved on with greater participation in functions and more support from players and members post training and games. A lot is put on for the benefit of players, so it would be great if it was reciprocated. Unfortunately, our margins were down due to increased costs. Soft drinks had their first increase in price in over a decade. With rising costs, we may need to adjust alcohol prices next season. During the off season we will work on a budget for the forthcoming season.

Two of the larger expenditure items involve a new website for the club and the sound system. While we had grants to cover some of the cost there is still a significant outlay. We also had a huge outlay in apparel where we had to pay out a previous contract. Going forward we really need to be more proactive on our ordering and ensure we don't overstock. In the meantime, we need to move a lot of stock that we have, some of which has been ordered free of charge for our juniors.

Running a cricket club in years gone, while a struggle at times, was pretty simple. Basically you could rely on bar sales and a couple of sponsors. These days the commitments are much greater, especially regarding player payments, the number of teams and outlays for things such as cleaning, waste, frogbox, internet, etc plus capital expenditure for new equipment for the rooms and the ground. Our financial position, however, will continue to be strong and enable us to meet our commitments, expected and unexpected.

In summing up, thanks go to our sponsor's wonderful support as well as Ben's continued efforts in sponsorship and support of our sponsors. Thanks also to our players, past players, supporters and families who support the club and make it such an enjoyable experience to be part off. I can't wait to see us compete in Div 2 against some old rivals like CYs, Digman, West and Imp under our new coach Ben Coddington.
